Example of tips were shared by SAPS:

1. Be vigilant when taking out the dustbins, don't put it out the day before and bring inside as soon as possible,
2. Avoid giving information about your employers, especially about their holidays and items like safes,
3. Rather swipe a bank card than carrying cash,
4. Don't try to be Heros during house robberies,
5. Be observant about suspicious/suspects vehicle's(ColourNameNumber),
6. Don't allow strangers into the property without being informed/ permitted by the owners, especially people posing as technicians or municipal employees,
7. During a house robbery, try to position your hands in the way you can untie yourself after the attackers left and always be calm.
8. Be a hard target, when walking, put your cellphone away and be aware of your surroundings.

School Search & Motivational Speaking Visit

The Carpe Diem school in Jochem street was recently visited by SAPS Lyttelton, the K9 Dog Unit as well as Clearview Rehabilitation Centre. This was a regular visit, during which the school was searched, and no illegal substances found. Each school in the area has a register signed by SAPS during the visit. IT also included a motivational talk by the representative from Clearview Rehabilitation Centre.

Arrests

1. The thief stealing house numbers was arrested and many house numbers found in his possession,
2. Another thief was caught by Brinant and arrest made by SAPS in possession of 2 mag rims with tyres.
3. On 14th March at 09:00, a beggar/vagrant was arrested for housebreaking in Wingate Park. On further investigation it was found that he was a parolee, involved in 15 other house breakings in the area. He shared that he puts his loot in a black wheelie bin and simply pull the bin to where he sells the goods.

Please put your dustbins out on the day of collection (not the night before) and bring it inside as soon as possible. Be vigilant when collecting your bin from the street, if possible, don't go out alone.
