Communities are comprised of many different people, each with his/her own skills, views and innovative ideas that can make a huge difference in the efficiency and effectiveness of the SA Police Service and the manner social crime prevention is approached in a specific area. Word-of-mouth is an effective tool in spreading a message and informed CPF members can empower their communities to have a say in their own safety and eradicate crime and criminals from their area.

Each one of us wants to live and work without fear of being robbed, raped or attacked. By joining my local CPF - I strengthen the human network against evil forces and ensure that I, my family, my neighbors and my community have peace of mind and a safe and secure environment to thrive and prosper in.

What becoming a member of a CPF entails:-

There is a misconception that joining a Community Policing Forum (CPF) means that you will be expected to patrol streets late at night.

- The CPF is more than just people who patrol the streets, so it will not be expected of you to be involved with the CPF on an operational level once you have joined, although it would be an advantage if you could.
- It is about you sitting at your window and looking out there, where you have a birds-eye view of what is going on and being proactive - a dent in crime.

What you need to know about the CPF:-

- The CPF fulfils a vital role in society, in assisting law enforcement officials in the fight against crime and exists in terms of Section 18 of the SAPS Act, 1995.
- The CPF falls under this SAPS Act and is an integral part of "Sector Policing".
- This legislated act recognizes the CPF as the only recognized consultative forum designed to permit communities to make their policing concerns known to police.
- The Community Policing Forum dictates rules, laws and effective structures, and is not a neighbourhood watch consisting of community members with no voice.
- The CPF's are consultative forums designed to permit communities to make their policing concerns known to the Police and to provide a vehicle for holding the police accountable to them.

- Operate and man the Joint Operations Centre (JOC)
- Provide and maintain a radio network for contributing members that require this service
- Access to an 24/7 emergency number for any emergency
- Create and maintain street groups on WhatsApp and Telegram to inform the community of security and environmental issues in the LS4 area
- Train and manage JOC operators to do duty during office hours and after hours on a 24/7
- Provide equipment to volunteer patrollers to enable them to effectively patrol the LS4 area safely (identification equipment, white roof lights, bullet proof vests, torches, etc)
- Provide self-defence training to community members
- Established Domestic Workers Forum to train domestic workers and gardeners in self-defence and train them to be vigilant to assist the security forces with information
- Initiate clean-ups in the community with the aid of volunteer community members
- Provide trauma counselling after an accident where counselling is needed
- Ongoing contact with police, ward councillors to improve all services
- Act as pressure group on community matters such as municipal service delivery ie Wolwespruit Wetlands and the Garstkloof Landfill site
- Host special events for contributing members - Special Ladies Day Coming Soon - watch this space.
- Identify contributing Welriet members with a Welriet sign at their property.
